Dear Friend:

I understand that you recently responded to The Readers Digest "Halt the Defecit" campaign, to indicate your support for reducing the federal budget deficit. As you probably know, the pub-

lisher forwarded your name to me. Allow me at this time to address your concerns on this critical

I believe that the continued economic vitality of our nation is hinged on the Congress' and the President's success in achieving significant spending reductions that reverse the deficit trend permanently. During Senate deliberations on the budget. I actively endorsed the only comprehensive budget proposal that would have achieved a balanced federal budget by 1990 Unfortunately, this alternative package was rejected.

On August 1. House and Senate conferees reached final agreement on a budget resolution for 1986. Regrettably, this package provided for only modest spending reductions and would still leave us saddled with \$100 Billion plus deficits through the foreseeable future, even under the most optomistic economic assumptions. Because this package offered no prospect of achieving a balanced federal budget, I voted

against it. Although the First Concurrent Budget Resolution only makes nonbinding recommendations which programs to cut, it establish binding ceilings which each of authorizing Congress committees are not to exceed when setting spending levels for government programs within their jurisdiction. When Senate committees take up the authorizing bills for 1986 later this year, I will urge my Senate colleagues to adopt spending authorizations below these ceilings. In spite of this initial setback, I will not abandon my efforts to bring the federal budget into balance.

Again, I appreciate having the benefit of your views.

Dear Dr. Redfield:

Q. My 14 year old daughter thinks she might want to be an optometrist. What are the educational requirements?

Homer Powell

A. She will need at least two to three years of college to enter a four year College of Optometry. Eighty percent of today's entering students, however, have a Bachelor's degree or higher.

In college, she will need to study calculus and such basic sciences as anatomy,

physiology, chemestry, physics, microbiology and physchology in order to fulfill the prerequisites for application to optometry school. Upon compelting her prerequisite studies in undergraduate school, she will be required to take comprehensive admission examination for optometry school admittance.

Once in an optometric college, she will study all aspects of functional vision and optics, plus such areas as ocular anatomy, disease and pharmacology. She will also work in a clinic setting, examining patients under her professor's su-During her pervision. fourth year, she will serve an internship in an optometric-based center to further her clinical skills.

Upon graduation, she must pass oral, written and practical examinations to earn a state license. Only then will she be qualified to care for the vision of others.
