MINUTES OF THE TEXAS NUTRITION COMMITTEE
June 1, 1946

The Texas Negro Nutrition Committee met in the living room of Evans Hall Dormitory, Prairie View University, June 1, 1946, at 1:30 P.M. with Mrs. I. W. Rowan, Chairman, presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The chairman stated that the January meeting was not held in Crockett because of weather conditions and the Fort Worth meeting.

The idea of a school lunch workshop was discussed by the group.

A motion by Mrs. E. A. Hubbard, seconded by Mrs. Louisa Bonham, carried that the Texas Negro Nutrition Committee sponsor a school lunch workshop.

A motion by Mrs. Bonham, seconded by Mr. C. D. Yancy, carried that a committee appointed by the chair find a meeting place for the workshop.

The chairman appointed Mrs. Louisa Bonham, Dr. G. R. Yerwood, and Mr. C. D. Yancy to work with Miss Elixabeth May, chairman of the School Lunch Committee.

It was the common consent of the group that it would be governed by the committee's findings on the school lunch workshop.

The chairman asked if there is another project that the committee would like to consider.

Mrs. Louisa Bonham suggested that something should be done about the dues collected from the different agencies. The chairman clarified the suggestion by saying that she had sent out material using her franking privilege which might have caused some persons to think that they had not received any material from the Texas Negro Nutrition Committee.

Mrs. Louisa Bonham, in a letter to the chairman, resigned as treasurer of the Texas Negro Nutrition Committee. A motion by Mrs. Rosetta Randolph and seconded by Mr. C. D. Yancy, carried that Mrs. Espanola Hubbard replace Mrs. Louisa Bonham, as treasurer.

It was suggested by Mr. Yancy and agreed to by the group that the committee sponsor only the School Lunch Workshop for the present time.

Miss Boss Edwards suggested that the committee arrange to have head cooks attend the meeting also principals of schools not operating lunch room.

The chairman suggested that the committee might look forward to sponsoring a Family Institute.

The committee agreed to send a report of the Food Preservation Conference to the editor of WHATS COOKING in reply to a request for an article from her.

The chairman, in her report of the last Texas State Nutrition Council Meeting, said that she was unable to attend and that she had no report.

After discussing what could be done and what was being done about emergency famine crisis, it was decided that each member encourage the people to help wherever possible.

If there is no place available for the school lunch workshop the second choice project program pertaining to food production and preparation for the family. In the event that the school lunch workshop does not materialize the food production and preparation for the family program is sponsored, the chair stated that only the chairmans would change and the same people would work with the chairman in charge.

The chairman urged each member to do whatever possible to make the lunch workshop a success and each one pledged to do his or her or his best to make the workshop a success.

The next meeting will be held at Mary Allen College, Crockett, Texas.
