

BISHOP COLLEGE

Bishop College was established in 1881 in Marshall, Texas, on the 10-acre estate of the Holcomb Family, which had been purchased by "illiterate ex-slaves" of Harrison County. After 80 years of helping young men and women develop their potentialities for scholarly achievement, professional competence and effective participation in the general processes of the democratic society in Marshall, the college marked a turn to a new chapter in its history by moving to Dallas, Texas, in 1961. The new Bishop story in Dallas, vibrant with a nucleus of new buildings of modern architecture, is poised to set forth a new dimension of academic achievement, one that is directed toward providing a learning environment and meaningful experiences which are consistent with high aims and principles.

In Athletics, Bishop College holds membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association, and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. At Bishop College, athletes are, first of all, students. No less academic excellence is accepted because of the athletic status. It is the aim of the college that this rigorous training of body and mind will prepare both the athletes of Bishop College and their opponents for the life ahead.



TONIGHT'S GAME

Tonight the Prairie View Panthers will be trying to continue their winning streak over the Bishop Tigers. Bishop has always given the Panthers a run for their money and tonight's game is no exception. The Tigers come into tonight's game with a 4-0 record while the Prairie View Panthers are 1-2. Bishop coached by Dwight Fisher has won the Gulf Coast Championship 6 of the 8 years they have been in the conference. Prairie View is coached by Hoover Wright who in time will give the Panthers the kind of winner they have been accustomed to. Herbert O'Neal, a 6' 1", 205 pound halfback, features a strong threat in the Tigers' attack, O'Neal has scored 7 touchdowns in the Tigers' four wins. Prairie View is sparked by speedy Uriel "Sloppy Joe" Johnson and All-American candidate Clarence Williams, a 6' 6", 265 pound offensive tackle and co-captain. Charles Williams and Luther Gentry will be playing in familiar territory as both played at Cobb Stadium for Pinkston High of Dallas. In Bishop's four wins they have defeated Texas Lutheran 18-7, Lane 47-28, Wiley 16-13 and Fisk 26-6. Prairie View has defeated Jackson State 10-8, lost to Southern 26-0 and lost to Grambling 22-14. Prairie View coach Hoover Wright has added speed to his backfield with fleet Otis Pointer, a 5' 7", 180 pounder from Houston (Yates). Other Panther stalwarts are Sam Adams, a defensive tackle, Lee Von Spencer and Minor Malonson at linebackers and Glen Woods, one of the SWAC best at defensive tackle. The Panthers have used several quarterbacks in their first three games with Allen Merchant, Huzzell Allen and junior Robert Hamilton looking impressive. Wright has been without the service of Hugh McKinnis, one of his better assistant coaches, McKinnis has been ill most of the season and is in the hospital at the present. Arthur Gilliam, a former Pinkston (Dallas) coach and former Prairie View star, has been added to the Prairie View staff. Charles Garcia, a former Prairie View star and Pinkston coach is a new addition to Bishop's staff.
