tration, which in 1983 caused the firing of Berry and two other commission members. In the interim Reagan sought to replace them with nominees who reflected his own conservative attitudes. However, Berry and the members of the commission sued Reagan and won.

Berry has also been very active in the Free South

African Movement, and believes the power of dramatic action has been born out of their movement. The day before Thanksgiving, Berry and a number of Black Leaders were arrested in front of the South African Embassy for demonstrating. The initial protest by Berry

and others touched off numerous protests and arrests at the Embassy. Since then, that incedent mushroomed into a nationwide protest by political leaders and students against the South African Government. The national protests have pushed congress and the Reagan Administration toward bringing economic sanctions against South Africa.





Our Readers Write ...

To Editor-Hotline Dear Sir:

Perhaps your readers may be interested in a letter I have mailed to both State Senator Kent Caperton and Representative L. B. Kubiak, as follows:

Dear Sir.

I am experiencing a problem which certainly is potentially important to many thousands of land cattle-raising owning, Texans. Attached is a more detailed statement of my whole problem with the Tax Appraisal Office, but the crucial, confiscatory tax problem is rather simple: My appliction to have (a 59 acre tract of) land designated for agricultural use has been denied in spite of the fact that the land has never been used for any other purpose than pasture and is, in fact, marginal for even this use. The Chief Appraiser, P. C. Kelly, in essence claims that because it is not as productive as the good pasture land in Waller County it cannot be designated for agricultureal use, and is assessing taxes of approximately \$50.00 per acre per year on land which is incapable of bringing in even \$7.00 per acre as pasture and for which I have not had an offer to buy of as much as \$1,200 per acre.

My reading of the law (Chap. 23 of the Property Tax Code) and discussion with my attorney and with

the attorney for the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association leads me to believe that I will win the case in District Court, but that will still leave me in the unenviable position of having spent a great deal of time and a large sum of money in fighting an opponent financed by my taxes, only to win a case which leaves me with no chance of profit.

Please let me know if you agree with my understanding that the intent of the law was to prevent just such financial disasters to cattlemen and

other farmers, and if so, your plans for amending the law so as to prevent further such confiscatory taxing attempts. After all, as things now stand, even after I have won this case in court, what is to stop Mr. Kelly from putting me through exactly the same thing next year?

Any help you can give will be greatly appreciated, probably by a great many other tax-payers and voters as well as by me.
