

Tommie Jerue lived in the Warren Independent School District and participated in the athletic program on the Warren high school team during the 1965-66 school year. The Warren Independent School District operated an integrated program for high school students and this boy played on the Warren high school team. The Warren district did not operate a separate high school for negro pupils.

This boy and his family have recently moved into the Woodville Independent School District and this boy is currently attending the Scott High School of this district which at this time is a negro high school. He exercised a Freedom of Choice form to attend the Scott high school and indicated that he planned to participate in the athletic program.

According to my understanding of the rules of your interscholastic league this boy sould be ineligible to participate in athletics in either the white high school or the negro high school of this district during the current school year. Please verify in writing whether my opinion is correct or whether this boy is eligible to participate in the athletic program of the Scott high school.

Thank you for the reminder of our conversation during the summer relative to the eligibility of Kenneth Washington.

We have reviewed this case and according to Article VIII, Section 2 Changing Schools--and Section 12 One Year rule, Kenneth Washington is ineligible to participate in football and basketball until he shall have been in attendance at the school to which he changes for one year preceding the contest. There are some provisions that he would be eligible but neither apply to his case.

The One Year rule would render him ineligible in both football and basketball for one calendar year in a school to which he changes. The exceptions here which would render Kenneth eligible do not apply to his case. He will be eligible however for track, baseball and all other League activities.

I regret that we cannot render an affirmative decision in this case. For this reason, I am suggesting that you delete his name from your football eligibility list and notify the District Director and member school.

Dear Mr. McGuire:

I have your letter of September 19, 1966 relative to the eligibility of a student who has recently moved into the school district.

According to Article VIII, Section 11, Changing Schools--"A pupil changing schools is not eligible in League Contests whose parents (or guardian) reside outside of the school district, until he shall have been in attendance at the school system to which he changes for one year preceding the contest;" provided the provisions do not apply in this case.

Section 12, One Year Rule of Article VIII, Page 20 of the League Rules and Regulations would render the pupil ineligible also. "A pupil who has represented a high school (other than his present school) or academy in either football or basketball is ineligible in both of these sports for one calendar year in a school to which he changes, except a pupil who changes from a school to which he has attended for at least one year having less than fifteen accredited units to the next higher class to his home, or the nearest in his county." He is eligible for other league activities.

Had he already been at Scott and elected to attend Wheat High School he would have been eligible.

I do trust that your understanding is in line with our League Rules which do parallel the University League Rules so far as eligibility is concerned. If in doubt you may always check the University League Rules.
