STATE FAIR CLASSIC

Prairie View A&M has served as host team in the Annual Classic since 1928. PV met Wiley College in the traditional game for 34 years with only a three year break in 1956 to play Tennessee State, and in 1957 and '58 with Texas Southern.

The Panthers became perennial winners against the Wildcats and outclassed Bishop College's Tigers in 1967 and 1970. The Bishop Tigers turned the tide with wins in 1968 and 1969, making the Cotton Bowl record 2-2 between the two teams.

Tennessee State University was the Panthers' opponent and victors in the 1971 game and in 1972 the Classic was not held due to scheduling conflicts. The Panthers and Tigers met last year in Cobb Stadium with Prairie View capturing a close 29-26 win.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Observers have billed the Prairie View-Bishop Cotton Bowl contest as the "rival of the year."

The Panthers and Tigers will square off for the 36th time Saturday, October 20, in an 8 p.m. kickoff. The Panthers have won 28, lost 6 and tied 2. The Panthers dominated the contest until 1968, when the Tigers defeated the Panthers in a Cotton Bowl packed house 13-10 to break a 30-year losing string to the Panthers. The Tigers won in 1969, also. After missing the 1971 season of play between each other, they returned in 1972 in Cobb Stadium and the Panthers won that contest in a rainy-soaking wet field to start a two game streak (PV won in 1970-29-26).

Hoover Wright, who took over the Panthers football team after head coach Theo Danzy was stricken with a heart attack and Bishop veteran mentor Dwight Fisher, are old coaching rivals. In their first meeting in 1966, Wright won 16-10 and again in 1967, 31-7. Bishop came back in 1968 and defeated the Panthers 13-0. Well the two meet again and Fisher will be trying to even the score at 2-2.

Panther scrimmage watchers are of the opinion that Fisher may have caught Wright too late in the season. After defeating Texas Lutheran (17-6) and rolling up a total offense of 342, the Panthers appear ready for any attack by the enemy. One of the Panthers biggest improvement has been in their running game, where halfback Tony Harris, has done most of the stepping. In the Panthers 342 yards of total offense, Harris stepped off 102 yards of real estate in 13 carries.

The opponents have found it unwise to key Harris, because quarterback Steven Francis, is as dangerous with the run as he is with the pass. In fact, Francis is the Panthers second leading rusher. Harvey Hardeman and Ed Lewis, have also contributed to the Panthers ground attack.

Another big reason Panther backs are running better is the people up front. The likes of Jessie Simon, Ellis Caple, Joe Bowden, Willie Davis, Ernest Jones, Aaron Brown and Tyrone Harland, have open spots to run through.

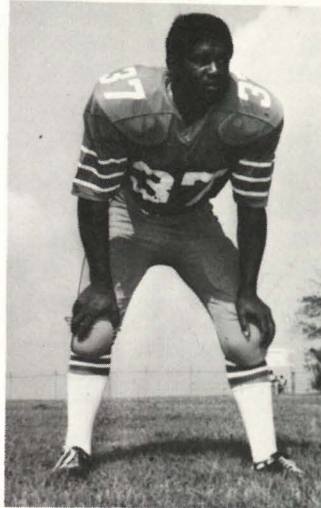
Another bright spot has been freshman quarterback Lonnie Parker from Ft. Worth-Terrell. Parker threw for 135 yards, including a 74 yard bomb to All American flanker John Moore, against Grambling a few weeks past.

Moore, who made several All American teams in 1971 is one of the most feared pass receivers in the country. His average yards per catch (23.4) is enough to give defensive backs the gitters. Phillip Brazille, Gerald Rideaux and Gary Tanner, are other classy receivers.

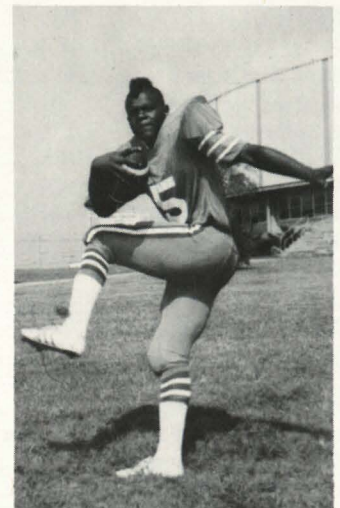
On defense the Panthers are tough. Opponent backs must tread with caution when in Panther territory. James Wolf, Jessie Wolf, Charlie Jackson, C. L. Whittington, Lester Morgan, David Shaw, Dufrey Thompson and Ken Austin, can make life miserable for ball carriers roaming in Panther domain.

The Tigers will pose a problem for the Panthers in quarterback Larry Hilton, who passed for 239 yards in the Tigers 31-15 win over McMurry.

SOUTHWESTERN (SWAC)

BRIEF HISTORY

The Southwestern Athletic Conference had its beginning as an alliance of small Texas schools in the early twenties. By mutual agreement, representatives from Jarvis, Texas College, Bishop, Prairie View and Paul Quinn met for preliminary consideration of a series of recommendations in 1921. They later acted upon the recommendations, resulting in the formal organization of the SWAC.

The function of the conference, as stated at the time, was to legislate the management and control of all intercollegiate athletics of the schools represented. With the exception of Prairie View charter membership was composed exclusively of church affiliated schools.

Later, Langston (Okla), Arkansas AM&N and Southern University were added by election. They were followed by Grambling, Alcorn A&M and Jackson State in the late fifties.

Wiley College, Marshall, Texas, the only church affiliated school holding membership in the league, dropped out in mid-summer of 1969 and was replaced by Mississippi Valley State, Itta Bena.

Today, the SWAC ranks as one of the nation's strongest small-college leagues. Conference teams have won national championships in basketball, baseball and track. The SWAC also ranks as one of the most prolific producers of professional football players, with Grambling placing next to Notre Dame in the number of active players.

Prairie View is the only charter member left in the conference.
