

I would like to enter a protest coming from a dispute in the shot-put at the district meet at Fidelity, April 15, 1967.

This occurred at around 9:20 a.m. when my boy made a put of over 50 feet. Listed below are how the events came about:

- (a) Bruce Smith, shot-putter from Sam Houston, made a put of over 50 feet.
- (b) It was marked as good by the ring official and area official.
- (c) Three more boys threw and were given marks.
- (d) The Fidelity coach talked to the shot ring official.
- (e) The ring official then ruled Bruce Smith's put was illegal.
- (f) Bruce threw  $\frac{1}{4}$  more times the exact same way and was given marks and they were counted.
- (g) The rule states the put must be from the shoulder, not from behind or below the shoulder.
- (h) Fidelity's shotputter delivered his put from his throat and it was counted.
- (i) The final result was Fidelity  $49'3\frac{1}{4}"$ , Elmore  $48'7\frac{1}{4}"$ , Sam Houston  $48'4"$ .

I have competed in track and field in High School and in college. I won the Lone Star Conference three years and placed in the shot. I have competed in the national meet 3 years and placed each time. I taught this boy to put in this manner and take full blame for his throwing this way. I believe he and I were cheated and think you should do something about it. Since when can a coach cause a throw to be illegal after more people have already thrown.


