



AUTHORITY FOR AND CONTENT OF PROTEST FOLLOWS:

Rules and Regulations, Page 22, Article IX, Disputes, provides that all protests must be made in writing within twenty-four hours after the contest to the district executive committee.

Protest must be presented by either Superintendent or Principal.

This protest addresses itself to a game played Friday, January 26, 1968 beginning around 8:15 p.m.

This is the situation, with East Liberty leading 64 to 62, with only seconds to play, Wyatt Teel, a Center player was fouled in the act of shooting or on the drive for the basket. According to the official timer, Mrs. Dorothy Jean Williams, time expired and the buzzer sounded as Teel was fouled. Neither the referee or umpire heard the buzzer and were apparently unawares that time had expired. Teel was awarded his foul shots, made them both, tying the score at 64-all. East Liberty inbounded the ball, took a desperation shot and was fouled. Our protest is that this foul occurred after play had expired and should have been disregarded. This situation is covered in the Rule Book.

Basketball 1967-68 Rule Book, Rule 2, Section 12 states,

“Expiration of playing time in each quarter, half or extra period shall be indicated by the timer’s signal. This signal terminates player activity. If the timer’s signal fails to sound, or is not heard, the timers shall go on the court or use other means to notify the referee immediately. If, in the meantime, a goal has been made or a foul has occurred, the referee shall consult the timers. If the timers agree that time expired before the ball was in flight, the goal shall not count. If they agree that the period ended (as in 5-6 (b) before the foul occurred, the foul shall be disregarded unless it was unsportsmanlike.

Note: Rule 2, Section 1 (Rule Book) permits the use of a single timer and a single scorer.

Mr. Alexander, we had a large crowd and a vociferous one. With all the noise, especially with the score close, you can understand the difficulty the officials would have in hearing the buzzer. Added to this is the fact that the situation occurred on the end of the court farthest from the clock.

All we are saying here and are registering this protest strictly on the basis of this opinion, is, that time had expired and when the officials were notified of this, the foul penalized after expiration of time s ould have been disregarded and the game ended with a tie score, 64-all


