Last basketball season (1966-67) we protested the eligibility of two players on the Concord High School team, Mt. Enterprise, Texas on the basis of their having played district ball while in the eighth grade. Our protest was disallowed with the explanation that the protested players should have been penalized in the eighth grade. Our decision to register the protest at that time was influenced by a decision made in the attached protest by Mr. Roger Williams in 1963-64 who was at the time coach as well as principal of Sunset High School Beckville, Texas, a district member. Mr. Williams' protest concerned a player who is a senior this year (1967-68) at the school mentioned in his protest. The school is yet a member of our district.

Now, Mr. Williams' protest was disallowed then by the district executive committee who ruled that this player (Charles McCowin) would be ineligible in his senior year. He is now a senior at that school.

We feel that the player is ineligible this year on the strength of the previous district executive committee ruling and in as much as he was protested in the eighth grade.

Mr. Williams is available for verification of these data.

Dear Cirs:

This letter is brought to your attention with respect to an ineligible player on Mast Liberty High School's team. This ineligible player entered a district ball game played at Center, Texas January 14, 1964, after the game was tied and went into two extra periods at which time player Matcliff No. 21 fould out; and, evidently, this alleged player, the most versatile player on the tench, was sent in as a substitute for Matcliff who had fould out of the same.

Contlemen, this seems to have been a premaditated act on the part of the school because of the fact this player has entered on the playing roster of regular players and wasn't on the eligibility roster sent to the district director's office or state office. Sirs, at that time this alleged player was enrolled in the elementary school of tast Liberty during the school year 1963-64.

Sirs, according to a newslatter dated October 9, 1963, and sent out by Mr. O. J. Thomas, State Mirector, I quote sentence 3 paragraph five "No eight grade pupil is eligible. It is a high school contest"

Gentlemen, the basketbell plan <u>hules and we, ul tion</u> page 66 item 21 specifically states the condition under which an individual may make a protest. Upon these grounds I make an appeal to you for your consideration. Fage 83 item (a) state your responsibilities in correcting these evils. Fage 84 item (8) states what can be done to the district with reference to the use of an ineligible player in any game. Item 15 page 85, along with sentence (4) paragraph (c) page 84, gives the answer to our problem.

irz, upon these bases I bring my protest to you against wast Liberty High Ochool for immediate action; that is, on or before January 26, 1965, in order that there will be plenty of time for a play off and state certification before February 18-19-20, which is our state meet.






