ENROLLMENT ESTIMATE FOR 1935-36

- I. 1. The total enrollment for 1934-35 is 730 students of College level.
2. Of this number 104 will graduate by end of the year.
3. This leaves 626 in Junior, Sophomore and Freshman classes who are eligible to return regular session 1935-36.
4. We estimate that 30% of the 626 students in #3 will not return, or 188.
5. Then 438 students from this year's enrollment will become our base estimate.
6. These are the sources of enrollment for 1935-36

(b) Hang over Seniors -----	10
(c) From the 166 who did not return from 1933-34 -----	22
(d) Junior Colleges in Texas -----	30
