ENROLLMENT ESTIMATE FOR 1935-36

- I. 1. The total enrollment for 1934-35 is 730 students of College level.
 - 2. Of this number 104 will graduate by end of the year.
 - 3. This leaves 626 in Junior, Sophomore and Freshman classes who are eligible to return regular session 1935-36.
 - 4. We estimate that 30% of the 626 students in #3 will not return, or 188.
 - 5. Then 438 students from this year's enrollment will become our base estimate.
