

THE COMMENCEMENT PROCESSION

An appropriate costume is a necessary part of Commencement. The costume includes a cap, a gown, and a hood. Each part of the costume has special significance. The most common head-piece (or cap) for the ceremony is the black square, flat-topped, or "mortar board" type with gold or black tassel. It is called a "mortar board" because it is shaped like the board of the mason which holds mortar. Recently we are seeing large velvet Tam-O-Shanter style of head pieces replacing the mortar board. Some of the velvet tams are brilliantly colored such as orange or bright blue.

The tassel on the doctor's cap is usually gold, and permanently fastened on the left side. The master's cap has a black tassel worn on the left. The bachelor's cap has a black tassel worn on the right prior to graduation then moved to the left during the ceremony.

The hood can be the most colorful part of the entire costume. The colors inside the hood are those of the college or university which is awarding the degree. The colors of the outside rim of the hood symbolizes one of the following departments of learning:

The gown is usually black. The traditional doctor's gown has velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the regular sleeves. The master's gown has no velvet, but does have unusually long sleeves. The bachelor's gown is similar to the master's gown but has regular long sleeves which tend to be pointed.

Some gowns may be in the color of the department granting the degree, such as "Education Blue." Others may be "Yale Blue" or "Harvard Crimson" for the graduates of these universities.

THE MACE

The mace is an ancient symbol of authority which is carried by the marshal ahead of the academic procession. The mace for Prairie View A&M University is four feet long and contains four bronze figures atop a Honduras mahogany base which tapers to fit into its stand. The four figures are symbolic of the four undergraduate academic years. Within the hollow area beneath the figures, and shared equally, is a flame which denotes knowledge and excellence. The base which serves as a grip and is carried by a faculty member, symbolizes the entire faculty; the stand which supports the mace characterizes the administration. The visual impact of the mace as a whole is "torch-like." The eight tassels represent the academic organization of the University.

THE MEDALLION

The President's Medallion, the official symbol of the Office of the President at Prairie View A&M University, was created especially to commemorate the lineage of the Presidency by the late Mr. Frank Hayden, nationally famous sculptor and Professor of Fine Arts at Southern University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The first medallion was presented to Dr. Percy A. Pierre, fourth president of Prairie View A&M University, on March 21, 1985.

The medallion is designed to be worn with academic regalia at all official University programs. Abstract figures, representing the ten academic disciplines in an attitude of celebration, encircle the outer rim. The inner circle symbolizes the pursuit of excellence throughout four years of teaching and learning. The weave of the chain is the facsimile of that used by the ancient Greeks.

A replica will be presented to each subsequent President during his inauguration. The medallion will ultimately reflect the history of the presidency, revealing names and dates of inauguration.

Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee

Hailed by *Ebony* magazine as one of the "100 Most Fascinating Black Women of the Century," and by the *Congressional Quarterly*, as one of the 50 most effective members in Congress, Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee has been in the United States House of Representatives since 1994 representing the 18th Congressional District of Houston, Texas. Prior to that Ms. Jackson Lee was on the Houston City Council and served also as an Associate Municipal Court Judge for the City of Houston. She was an active member of the State Bar of Texas and is only one of three African-American women to have served as Director of the State Bar of Texas. From 1987 to 1988, she chaired the Justice Court Subcommittee of the Texas Bar. Congresswoman Jackson Lee is also a former Director of the Texas Young Lawyers' Association, and was Chair of its Minority Affairs Committee.

Congresswoman Jackson Lee, who earned her bachelor's degree with honors from Yale and her law degree, the Juris Doctorate, from the University of Virginia School of Law, is a veteran of both corporate and private law practice. She is a member of the House Committee on the Judiciary where she serves on the Subcommittee on Crime. She was selected as the first African-American woman to serve as the ranking democrat on the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims.

The Congresswoman has supported NASA and its contribution to American science and medical research. She offered an amendment in 1999 to restore funds to NASA during the appropriations process. In this role, the Congresswoman has been a strong advocate for Historically Black Colleges and Universities, as well as, Hispanic serving institutions. She has convened a meeting of the presidents of these institutions in Washington, DC and has worked to ensure that part of NASA's funding is used for the recruitment and training of students from minority serving colleges and universities. Congresswoman Jackson Lee is also a member of the newly formed Select Committee on Homeland Security. She serves on the Subcommittee on Infrastructure and Border Security and the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Science, and Research & Development.

During her tenure in Congress, Congresswoman Jackson Lee has served as Co-Chair of the Congressional Children's Caucus; Co-Chair of the Democratic Caucus's Children's Taskforce; Speaker on the Bi-Partisan Taskforce on Youth Violence; and member of the Congressional Human Rights Caucus, the Congressional Caucus on Women's Issue, and the Congressional Black Caucus where she has served as the Whip for two terms. Ms. Jackson Lee served on the Aeronautics and Space Caucus, the House Internet Caucus, and the House Democratic Caucus Task Forces on Hunger, Entertainment, Welfare Reform, Economic Renewal, Affirmative Action and Travel and Tourism. For her outstanding work on mental health legislation the Congresswoman Jackson Lee was recognized. She has been an active member of the Judiciary Committee's Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative Law where she spearheaded legislation that would protect child support payments in bankruptcy proceedings, and ensure that all priority payments like child support and alimony would be paid before any unsecured creditors.

Currently, Ms. Jackson Lee is First Vice Chair of the Congressional Black Caucus. She has distinguished herself as a staunch defender of the Constitution, civil rights and juvenile justice, protection of America's health needs, gun safety and responsibility, and economic empowerment for low and middle income America. Congresswoman Jackson Lee has been an advocate on human rights issues and has passed legislation that instructs the National Science Foundation to donate surplus computers and scientific equipment to elementary and secondary schools. The Congresswoman also increased funding for the Sims Bayou flood control by \$3.5 million which assisted in ending the flooding of residential communities in Harris County, Texas.

Congresswoman Jackson Lee is married to Dr. Elwyn C. Lee, Vice Chancellor of the University of Houston System and Special Assistant to the Chancellor of the University of Houston System. She is the mother of Erica Shelwyn and Jason Cornelius Bennett Lee.
