Subject: Atlantic Coast Migratory Movement

GENERAL OUTLOOK

Demand for migrant workers continues strong in New Jersey, New York, Delaware, and Maryland. Some migrants are returning to Florida. Eight crews totaling 87 workers returned from August 6 through the 10th.

Florida county agents mailed notices to States north, notifying supervisors the date of arrival of workers in spring and summer. County agents in the south would appreciate notice of return of crews from northern States in the fall.

NEW JERSEY

Area 34. Potato digging will be as rapid as weather will permit, and labor is needed in the area. This deal will move fast because most potatoes are stored on farm for purchase.

Area 33. Tomato harvest is at its peak and will continue through October 1. The supply of labor in the area is needed to move the tomato and peach crops.

MARYLAND

Area 30. The Pocomoke area will need 150 additional workers the week of August 19 to move the crop of green beans. The demand for migrant workers is light in other areas of Eastern Shore, Md.

NEW YORK

Area 35, Long Island. Potato harvest is in full swing, delayed only by shortage of cars. Snap and lima beans will start by the middle of August. Most small private housing requests have been filled by crews and family groups.

Area 36, Hudson Valley. Cherry and current picking is over. Bean picking has started. Early apples started. Kinderhook camp open for 75 workers. Contact Craig Earl, Hudson 1316, for placement.

Area 37, Snap bean harvest in full swing. Request for three crews, 75-125 workers. Contact Charles Collins, Placement Office, Utica 4-8816.

Cayuga County - One hundred workers needed. Contact C.L. Messer, Auburn 554.

Area 38. Niagara County. One hundred workers needed in tomato picking, August 25. Contact Ed Hertel, Lockport 1021. Eric County - beans and potatoes a week late. Wayne County - bean harvest under way. Tomatoes and apples coming on fast. Contact Leo Dillon, Sodus 2711. Genesee County - Bergen camp for 150 workers now open. Contact B. L. Culver, 542 Batavia.

APPLE HARVEST

Area 29. An estimated 20 million bushels of apples will begin to move from the Appalachian apple area about September 1 and will continue through December. Migrant crews should contact county agents before going into the area.
