

THE COMMENCEMENT PROCESSION

An appropriate costume is a necessary part of Commencement. The costume includes a cap, a gown, and a hood. Each part of the costume has special significance. The most common head-piece (or cap) for the ceremony is the black square, flat-topped, or "mortar board" type with gold or black tassel. It is called a "mortar board" because it is shaped like the board of the mason which holds mortar. Recently we are seeing large velvet Tam-O-Shanter style of head pieces replacing the mortar board. Some of the velvet tams are brilliantly colored such as orange or bright blue.

The tassel on the doctor's cap is usually gold, and permanently fastened on the left side. The master's cap has a black tassel worn on the left. The bachelor's cap has a black tassel worn on the right prior to graduation then moved to the left during the ceremony.

The hood can be the most colorful part of the entire costume. The colors inside the hood are those of the college or university which is awarding the degree. The colors of the outside rim of the hood symbolizes one of the following departments of learning:

The gown is usually black. The traditional doctor's gown has velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the regular sleeves. The master's gown has no velvet, but does have unusually long sleeves. The bachelor's gown is similar to the master's gown but has regular long sleeves which tend to be pointed.

Some gowns may be in the color of the department granting the degree, such as "Education Blue." Others may be "Yale Blue" or "Harvard Crimson" for the graduates of these universities.

THE MACE

The mace is an ancient symbol of authority which is carried by the marshal ahead of the academic procession. The mace for Prairie View A&M University is four feet long and contains four bronze figures atop a Honduras mahogany base which tapers to fit into its stand. The four figures are symbolic of the four undergraduate academic years. Within the hollow area beneath the figures, and shared equally, is a flame which denotes knowledge and excellence. The base which serves as a grip and is carried by a faculty member, symbolizes the entire faculty; the stand which supports the mace characterizes the administration. The visual impact of the mace as a whole is "torch-like." The eight tassels represent the academic organization of the University.

THE MEDALLION

The President's Medallion, the official symbol of the Office of the President at Prairie View A&M University, was created especially to commemorate the lineage of the Presidency by the late Mr. Frank Hayden, nationally famous sculptor and Professor of Fine Arts at Southern University, on March 21, 1985.

The medallion is designed to be worn with academic regalia at all official University programs. Abstract figures, representing the ten academic disciplines in an attitude of celebration, encircle the outer rim. The inner circle symbolizes the pursuit of excellence throughout four years of teaching and learning. The weave of the chain is the facsimile of that used by the ancient Greeks.

A replica will be presented to each subsequent President during his inauguration. The medallion will ultimately reflect the history of the presidency, revealing names and dates of inauguration.

ROBERT L. STINNETT

Dr. Stinnett is a native of Dallas, TX and a 1953 graduate of Prairie View A&M University where he earned a BS degree in mathematics and a commission of 2d Lieutenant, US Army, through the University Army ROTC program.

He completed a distinguished military career of 20 years before retiring in 1973 with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. During his military career he was one of the first black pioneers in Army Aviation earning his pilot wings in January 1956. He was rated in both fixed and rotary wing aircraft attaining the highest military pilot rating of Master Army Aviator. During his military career he served in command and staff positions in aviation units throughout the continental United States, Germany, The Republic of Korea and Vietnam. He servd two tours of combat duty in the Republic of Vietnam as commander of Army helicopter units and earned two awards of the Distinguished Flying Cross for heroism, the Air Medal with "V" device for heroism, the Bronze Star Medal for meritorious achievement, the Army Commendation Medal for meritorious service and numerous campaign and service medals and awards. Dr. Stinnett has been featured in two best seller publications pertaining to the Vietnam war, "Chickenhawk", by Robert Mason, published by The Viking Press, and "We Were Soldiers Once...And Young" by Lieutenant General (R) Harold Moore and Joseph L. Galloway, published by Random House. The latter book was developed into the 2002 movie production "We Were Soldiers" starring Mel Gibson. Also in 2000, he was featured in the documentary "Flight Line: The Army Helicopter Pilots of Vietnam" produced by Flight Line Partners, LLC, hosted and narrated by actor Harrison Ford.

After retiring from military service, Dr Stinnett continued his pursuit of higher education and earned his Masters and Doctorate degrees from The University of Oklahoma and Pacific Western University respectively. He joined the University of Oklahoma staff as an instructor and curriculum develotment specialist at the Federal Aviation Management Training School at Cameron University in Lawton, OK. Upon retiring from the University of Oklahoma in 1990, he initiated and founded the Management & Employees Training & Development Consultant Services (METD) firm where he still serves as President and Senior Consultant.

Dr. Stinnett is a life member of the Prairie View A&M University National Alumni Association and serves on the board of directors. He has been President of the Class of 53 Alumni Chapter since 1990. He is also a member of the University of Oklahoma Alumni Association, the Omega Psi Fraternity where he is a past Basilius of the Psi Upsilon chapter, and is a past member on the Advisory committee of the Business Development council at the Lawton Great Plains Technology Center. He is also a member of The Military Officers Association and The Army Aviator Association of America, Inc.

Dr Stinnett lives in Lawton, Oklahoma. He is the proud parent of five children, the oldest a graduate of Prairie View and a member of The Prairie View A&M University Sports Hall of Fame.
