## C. THE NEXT BIENNIAL BUDGET -

The last Texas Legislature made appropriations for teaching positions at all state-supported institutions on a 9 months basis only. This is the first time that Prairie View State College has been designated for this basis of operation. However, all administrative positions are scheduled for 12 months. This means that the Summer School will be operated on an entirely different basis from that of the Regular Session. Hereafter, the instructional cost of operating the Summer School will come from the Summer School appropriation and income from tuition fees only.
