



PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY HISTORY AND RELEVANCE

Prairie View A&M University, the second oldest public institution of higher education in Texas, originated in the Texas Constitution of 1876. The A&M College of Texas for Colored Youths opened at Prairie View, Texas on March 11, 1878. The University's original curriculum was designated by the Texas Legislature in 1879 to be that of a "Normal School" for the preparation and training of teachers. This curriculum was expanded to include the arts and sciences, home economics, agriculture, mechanical arts, and nursing after the University was established as a branch of the Agricultural Experiment Station (Hatch Act, 1887) and as a land-grant college (Morrill Act, 1890).

In 1919, the four-year senior college program was begun and, in 1937, a division of graduate studies was added, offering mater's degrees in agricultural economics, rural education, agricultural education, school administration and supervision, and rural sociology.

In 1945, the name of the institution was changed from Prairie View Normal and Industrial College to Prairie View University, and the school was authorized to offer, "as need arises," all courses offered at the University of Texas. In 1947, the Texas Legislature changed the name of Prairie View A&M College of Texas. On August 27, 1973, the name of the institution was changed to Prairie View A&M University, and its status as an independent unit of the Texas A&M University System was confirmed.

In 1983, the Texas Legislature proposed a constitutional amendment that dedicated the University to enhancement as an "institution of the first class" under the governing board of the Texas A&M University System. The constitutional amendment was approved by the voters on November 6, 1984.

In October 2000, the governor of Texas signed the Priority Plan, an agreement with the U.S. Department of Education Office of Civil Rights, to make Prairie View A&M University an educational asset accessible

by all Texans. The Priority Plan mandates creation of many new educational programs and facilities.

Prairie View A&M University is dedicated to excellence in teaching, research, and service. It is committed to achieving relevance in each component of its mission by addressing issues and proposing solutions through programs and services designed to respond to the needs and aspirations of individuals, families, organizations, agencies, schools, and communities both rural and urban. The University is committed to preparing undergraduates in a range of careers including engineering, computer science, natural sciences, architecture, business technology, criminal justice, the humanities, education, agricultural sciences, nursing, and the social sciences. It is committed to advanced education through the master's degree and expanding its advanced educational offerings to include multiple doctoral programs.

The University's enrollment now exceeds 6,700 including over 1,300 graduate students. Students come from throughout the United States as well as many foreign countries. Over 5,200 academic degrees have been awarded in the last five years, including over 1,800 graduate degrees.





WILLIE A. TEMPTON INTERIM PRESIDENT

PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY

Willie Tempton was named acting president of Prairie View A&M University effective May 21, 2002. Just 16 days later, after a unanimous recommendation by the university's leadership council to Texas A&M University System Chancellor Howard Graves, he was appointed as interim chief executive officer by the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents.

"Mr. Tempton brings tremendous experience in university administration," said Chancellor Graves in a system news release. "He is well-qualified to lead the university during this time of transition and during the legislative session that begins in January."

A native of Waxahachie, Texas, Tempton graduated from Prairie View A&M University in 1961 with a bachelor's degree in biology. A War College graduate too, he has also done graduate study in guidance and counseling.

In 1992, Tempton retired from the United States Army after serving 38 years. Later that year, he returned to Prairie View A&M serving as Assistant to the Vice President for Finance and Administration. As an assistant to the vice president, he worked projects relating to budget management, physical plant management, corporate travel and audits within the university. Four years later, in 1996, he was named vice president for finance and administration at the university.

As the vice president for finance and administration, he oversees the fiscal activity and management of the university's \$150 million budget. He was instrumental in establishing Prairie View A&M's presence within Compaq Computer Corporation's Northwestern Houston facilities by successfully developing a plan to prepare and occupy the facility within the required time-frame.

Owning a distinguished military past, Tempton has served two tours of duty in Vietnam as a combat pilot. Besides holding the rank of colonel, Tempton holds two bronze star medals, one for valor and a legion of merit medal.

For 44 years, Tempton has been married to the former Mary Jackson of Waxahachie. They have four children, Willie, Jr., Gerald, Eleanor and Sharon along with seven grandchildren.





CHARLES McCLELLAND ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY

Charles McClelland enters his second year as the athletics director at Prairie View A&M University. An innovative administrator, McClelland has the knowledge, energy and enthusiasm necessary to help return the Prairie View A&M athletics program to the pinnacle of excellence it once enjoyed.

As athletics director, McClelland oversees 18 sports — 10 women's sports and eight men's. His daily duties include overseeing budgets, scheduling, fund raising, marketing and keeping abreast of NCAA rules and regulations. In doing so, his biggest task is reviving an athletics program that was once a power-house.

In his first year, McClelland wasted no time laying the groundwork to revitalize the Prairie View A&M athletics program. He has hired new coaches in men's basketball and baseball. Other personnel plans currently on tap are hiring a new full-time strength and conditioning coach. He has guided a program that was placed on probation by the NCAA prior to his arrival back to full rights and privileges of NCAA membership.

Other improvements made during McClelland's first year include the implementation of an incentive pay structures for coaches, the establishment of an athletics scholarship endowment, the addition of women's soccer and the increase of scholarship allotments for men's and women's basketball.

McClelland has used his accounting and business savvy to reduce the athletics deficit by \$310,000 and generated an additional \$400,000 in revenue for the

2002-03 academic year through game guarantees and corporate sponsorships.

A nine-year veteran at Prairie View A&M, McClelland has served as assistant to the dean and director of development in the School of Architecture. In the School of Architecture, his primary responsibilities included assisting with day-to-day operations, all fiscal activity and management of a \$1.5 million budget. During his stint in the School of Architecture, he was instrumental in starting a pilot laptop computer program for students.

A strong advocate that athletics should work hand-in-hand with the academic sector, McClelland believes that an athletics program is the cornerstone for gaining the institution additional recognition academically.

Before joining the School of Architecture in 1998, McClelland was the assistant director of financial aid at the university, where he awarded all scholarships. He was also senior staff accountant from 1994 to 1996 and staff accountant from 1993 to 1994 at the university.

No stranger to athletics, McClelland has served as a member of the university's Athletic Council the past four years and color commentator on the Panther Sports Network radio broadcast since 1996. During the 1996-97 school year, he served as head men's and women's golf coach.

A 1993 graduate of Prairie View A&M, McClelland earned his B.A. in accounting and in 1997 he received an MBA from Prairie View A&M. He is currently in his final year pursuing a Ph.D. in higher education administration at Texas A&M University.

A native of Jackson, Mississippi, McClelland's extra-curricular affiliations include memberships in the Prairie View A&M University National Alumni Association, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Phi Beta Lambda and the National Association of Black Accountants.

McClelland is married to the former Elonda Ledet of Lafayette, Louisiana. They have two sons, Cainan (4) and Ashton (2).

DORSEY DESTINED TO RETURN PRAIRIE VIEW TO THE PINNACLE OF ATHLETIC EXCELLENCE

Prairie View A&M head football coach Larry Dorsey long ago established a reputation as a man who can squeeze the most out of meager supplies. Couple that with his commitment, loyalty, dedication and determination, then surely he's destined to return the Panther football program to the pinnacle of athletic excellence it once enjoyed.

Beginning his third season this fall as Prairie View A&M University's head football coach, Dorsey is the school's 20th head football coach.

Last year Dorsey coached the team to its best finish in 13 years with a 3-7 overall record and a seventh-place finish in the 10-member Southwestern Athletic Conference. In 2000, his first season, he coached the team to its first Southwestern Athletic Conference victory since the 1989 season with a 25-22 win over Alcorn State. The victory snapped a league record of 67 straight losses. Despite only one win, his team finished the season tied for eighth in the SWAC. All of this from a man who arrived at Prairie View just one month before fall camp.

A native of Corinth, Mississippi, Dorsey is a 1976 graduate of Tennessee State University. As a collegiate player, he earned All-American honors in 1974 and 1975 at receiver. He was selected to participate in the Senior Bowl, Coaches All-Star Classic and the East-West Shrine Classic. In 1977 he was a third round draft of the San Diego Chargers. After two seasons with the Chargers he was

traded to the Kansas City Chiefs. He later signed with the Seattle Seahawks in 1979 and the New Orleans Saints in 1980.

Dorsey began his coaching career in 1982 when he joined the staff at Delta State University. Prior to coming to Mississippi Valley State, he served as an assistant coach for five years at Delta State. He also spent one season at Mississippi Valley, two years at Arkansas Pine Bluff and one year at the University of Mississippi, all in assistant roles.

As the head football coach at Mississippi Valley State, his 1996 squad had a banner year, posting a 7-4 overall record (5-2 in the SWAC) and finished the season tied for second in the conference. The 1996 season was capped by Dorsey being named SWAC coach of the year. His best record as the head mentor at Mississippi Valley came in 1991 with a 7-3-1 finish (3-3-1 in the SWAC).


Dorsey has worked at all levels of collegiate football. He's coached in the SWAC, the Gulf South Conference and the Southeastern Conference. He is a member of the American Football Coaches Association, the Mississippi Football Coaches Association, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY PROFILE

he movement in Louisiana for an equal opportunity institution of higher learning was sponsored in the 1879 Louisiana State Constitutional Convention by delegates P.B.S. Pinchback, T.T Allain, T.B. Stamps, and Henry Demas. Their efforts resulted in the establishment of this institution's first campus in New Orleans. Chartered by Legislative Act 87 in April 1880, Southern University had a 12-member Board of Trustees. The act provided for the establishment of a faculty of "arts and letters" competent in "every branch of liberal education." The act provided for "graduate students and grant degrees pertaining to arts and letters" for "persons competent and deserving.' Southern opened with 12 students. Later, with passage of the 1890 Morrill Act, the University was reorganized to receive land-grant funds.

In 1912, Legislative Act 118 authorized the closing of Southern University in New Orleans and the reestablishment of the University on a new site. In 1914, the "new" Southern University opened north of Baton Rouge in what was then Scotlandville, Louisiana, receiving a portion of a national land-grant. New campuses in New Orleans and in Shreveport were authorized by Legislative Acts 28 and 42 in 1956 and 1964, respectively. The Southern University Board of Supervisors, a management board authorized by the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, was created to govern the Baton Rouge, New Orleans, and Shreveport campuses. In 1985, the A.A. Lenoir Law School was designated the Southern University Law Center, a fourth campus.

Today, Southern University and A&M College is a comprehensive institution offering four-year, graduate, professional, and doctoral degree programs. The University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and is part of the only historically black landgrant university system in the United States. Southern offers 42 bachelor's, 20 master's, four doctoral, and three associate degree programs. An average of 9,000 students are enrolled each year at the Baton Rouge campus.


