## F THE FARMERS SHORT COURSE -



To Applicants for Graduate Aid:

Many inquiries have come to the State Department of Education concerning graduate and professional aid for Negro students in out-of-state institutions.

The Legislature provided \$25,000 per annum for the next biennium to be used for that purpose. It set up a Committee to handle it, consisting of the Graduate Deans from the University of Texas, A and M College and Sam Houston State Teachers College.

The deans have met and set up tentative plans which we understand provide the following:

- 1 Consider only applications from graduates of standard four-year colleges, who have resided in Texas a minimum of 8 years.
- 2 Pay the excess tuition charge required by the out-of-State institution over that required at Prairie View - limited to \$200 except for Medical and Law students, which may receive up to \$300.
- 3 Allow travel at three cents per mile along the most direct route, less the distance from the applicant's home to Prairie View - limited to \$100.
- 4 Allow ten percent of the amount of the above grants to take care of extra cost of living in out-of-State centers.
