D FINALLY SIXTY YEARS -

<u>On August 8, 1881</u> - just sixteen years after General Lee surrendered to General Grant - reconstruction was taking definite form and complexion - 4,000,000 newly emancipated slaves, native sons and their descendants were categorically assigned "their places" in American Democracy - <u>I WAS BORN</u>. These sixty years can be roughly divided into three periods, viz -

- A <u>From 1881 to 1901</u> at home on the farm. Those were years of laying the ground work of my life; years of Hoping and Dreaming; hoping that I might grow up and attend Atlanta University and dreaming of the outcome of subsequent years.
- B From 1901 to 1909 attending Atlanta University for 8 1/2 months in the year and working my farm for 3 1/2 months. During this period, I began to learn books and men and to make friends. These friends are still mine. One was a light brown 100 pound girl whom I led to the altar June 1, 1911. Above all, I found here what it took to win, control and hold men. I was a student an all round student.
- C From 1909 to 1941 at work. A period of making dreams walk and talk and live in the lives of men and women. A period of sacrifice, hard labor, struggle, tribulation and happiness. Here I came nearest to God when I forgot myself in working for "their sakes."

In these sixty years, I have heard and seen much, so much that I would live in mortal fear, but for the comforting thought of these words - by Leslie Pinkney Hill -

LINES ON LEADERSHIP

"To be a leader! What is that to be? To stand between a people and their foes And earn suspicion for a recompense; To care for men more than they care themselves: To keep a clear, discriminating mind Between the better counsel and the best; To be a judge of men, that none may rank In estimation higher than his worth: Nor fail of scope to prove his quality; To search the motive that explains the act Before it is accounted good or bad; To trust a man, and yet not be dismayed To find him faithless, going on again To trust another; to build failure up Into the tedious structure of success; To meet the subtle enemy within As well as him without, and vanquish both; To see the cause betrayed by those who pledge The strictest loyalty; to overmatch The envious with magnanimity; To labor through the day, and through the night To watch and plan and exorcise by prayer The devil troop of doubts that tease the will; To have a body that endures the strain Of labor after labor, each in turn Demanding more of nerve and hardihood To stand before your conscience offering The utmost tithe of mortal sacrifice While selfish little critic parasites Heckle and plot and spread malignant lies; To walk through trouble with a heart that drips The blood of agony, yet with a face Of confidence and bright encouragement; To do and do and die to raise a tribe So robbed and bound and ignorantly weak That God himself conceals their destiny To be a leader! God, that is the cost!"

Now I go forward determined to "find a way or make one."
