Prairie View Won!

A number of years ago a young English boy was asked about the American Revolution. The opening question was put in such a manner that the questioner expected at least a five minute answer, but the lad replied with all the naivete of youth, "Oh, that thing, Sir?" That thing was merely the process through which England lost what is now the United States. Langston people, then, would certainly turn up quizzical noses when Prairie View people say "Prairie View won!" All Prairie View lost Homecoming Day was a football game, and since the first football game was played one of the teams always had the honor of losing.
