

VACATIONS OF TWELVE-MONTHS EMPLOYEES

A-4.2

July 15, 1940

1. - Under State law, annual vacation for each twelve-months employee is limited to twelve (12) working days. Saturdays are to be counted as full days.

If special leaves of absence (except for sickness) are given during the year, the period of the annual vacation is to be reduced accordingly.

An employee is entitled to a vacation only as a part of a full year of continuous service, and vacations are not allocated on the basis of fractions of a year. As a matter of convenience to all concerned, however, a new employee who entered the service of the College at or prior to the beginning of a fiscal year and expects to continue in such service, may be granted a vacation near the close of that fiscal year.

Vacations are given for the purpose of refreshing the individual in anticipation of the succeeding year's work. A person leaving the service of the College by resignation or dismissal is not entitled to a vacation or to receive compensation after he actually ceases to render service.

Annual vacations are not cumulative and not over twelve days may be allowed in any fiscal year.

2. - Divisions which are supported in part by the Federal Government are authorized to make such adjustments for cooperative employees as are necessary to conform to Federal regulations.

3. - Requests for vacation leaves are to be made on the usual form, and absences on vacation are to be included in an annual report of "days absent from duty" on a form to be provided later.
