C WAR RELIEF -

Waller County has been asked to raise \$4,500 on the National quota of a United Relief Fund for War Charities. There are twenty two relief agencies combined in this drive. Prairie View has been asked to raise \$500.00 of the Waller County allotment. It is our hope to raise most of this assignment from Benefit Movies in order that the staff will be asked to contribute only a small amount. Mr Abernethy will be the official representative of the college to head this drive. Again we are asked to do our duty!

D STAFF PROJECTS -

Each year the Staff of Prairie View State College sponsors two important projects, known as -

1-Faculty Entertainment

It was voluntarily voted several years ago that the Staff and their wives should sponsor two entertainments on a dignified plane. Each one was asked to pay \$1.00 and two representative and worthwhile entertainments would be provided under the direction of committees designated for this purpose. These have been events long

to be remembered, most of the faculty participating. This year the first entertainment will be in the charge of Mr Harry E Fuller and will take place Tuesday evening, December 14. It is the hope that we shall have 100% participation. Mr G W Buchanan is Treasurer for the fund.

2-Faculty Community Chest -

Out of necessity and experience the faculty voted years ago to combine all of its charities with the Faculty Community Chest. We have had practically 100% participation. The sum of 2½% of one month's salary was contributed. The money accruing from this source has served a most important service for the college. Let us begin paying this obligation in December. Mr G W Buchanan is Treasurer for this fund.

E LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE-

We are pleased to announce that the Southwest Area Council Y M C A will hold a Leadership Institute at Prairie View State College on December 11-12, 1943 with Dr Charles D Hubert of Morehouse College, Atlanta, Georgia as discussion leader. This institute will bring to Prairie View a number of college and high school delegates, both male and female. This gathering promises to be one of the high lights of the campus activities for this year.

F AND FINALLY-


It is significant to observe that the total College enrollment in the 17 Negro Land Grant Colleges for 1941-1942 was 12,516. This enrollment is distributed as follows:

Arts and Sciences 8,315, Education 1,713, Home Economics 799, Agriculture 585, Commerce 231, Music 59, Nursing 40, Law 35, Engineering of all types 23, Fine arts 10, and Architecture 1.

Note: Enrollment for this period in Agriculture at Prairie View 206, Home Economics 246 and Nursing 40.
