C. UNITED NEGRO COLLEGE FUND CAMPAIGN -

Twenty seven Negro Private and Church related Colleges have organized a unique Campaign to raise from the general public \$1,500,000 with Mr John D Rockefeller, Jr of New York City as General Chairman. The Jinance Committee is composed of some of the outstanding men and Finance Committee is composed of some of the outstanding men and women of both races in the country. The last report revealed that \$500,000 have already been raised and there is every indication that the desired goal will be reached according to schedule.

These twenty seven colleges have made a signal and substantial contribution to the progress of the Negro race and America.
