

# D. CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS -

Due to Christmas coming on a Monday this year and the desire to avoid week-end travel, Christmas Holidays will be longer than usual. School work will be suspended at noon December 21, 1944 and class work will be resumed at 7:30 A M January 3, 1945.

# E. SIXTH WAR LOAN -

The Federal Government is asking each citizen to buy bonds in the present drive to help carry on the war. This is not a gift but it is Aid with interest. This, in fact, is a form of saving. Prairie View again is asked to participate in the Waller County quota which is \$215,000. Professor J J Abernethy is our official representative.

# F. "Y" LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE -

Prairie View State College began the sponsorship of a "Y" Leadership Institute about nine years ago, bringing here the faculty and student leadership of the High Schools and Colleges in Texas. It has been the practice of the College to furnish entertainment free to the delegates and also to provide an outstanding minister as discussion leader. We are fortunate this year in securing the services of Dr Joseph W Nicholson, Professor of Christian Ethics, Gammon Theological Seminary, Atlanta, Georgia for guest speaker. Dr Nicholson is one of the foremest scholars and ministers of our day.

# G. CHRISTMAS PAY DAY -

It has been the long standing custom of the State to make the December Pay Roll for all State employees on or by December 20. Since the new ruling of the Attorney General, to the point a pay roll cannot be notarized before all units of work are done, it is doubtful, therefore, that the custom of "pay day" before Christmas will obtain this year. This information is given so that we might be in the position to plan in the light of it.

My dear Principal Banks:

I am pleased to inform you that at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the General Education Board on October 27, 1944, the sum of \$30,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, was appropriated to Prairie View State Normal and Industrial College for equipment of the new library building and for books and periodicals estimated to cost \$60,000, payment by the Board to be on a dollar for dollar basis as funds are provided by the College for the same purposes, the appropriation to be available through December 31, 1949.

The appropriation was voted pursuant to your letter of request of July 7th, in which you state that the cost of equipment for the library building is estimated at \$40,000 and that at least \$20,000 is required for book purchases during the next five years. Of the Board's appropriation approximately \$20,000 will be available toward the equipment and approximately \$10,000 toward book purchases.

As funds become available for the purposes mentioned please inform us and arrangements will be made for payment of the sums called for. Any part of the appropriation not called for by December 31, 1949, will revert to the Board.
