- (1) Juniors and Seniors who have had two years of college mathematics including calculus, who have completed their mathematical work with a 3.00 average and who have a 2.50 average in their general college work.
- (2) Sophomores who have completed at least three semesters of college mathematics including one semester of calculus, who have achieved a 4.00 average in all mathematics courses taken, and who have a 3.00 average in their general college work. In addition, mathematics majors must belong to the Mathematics Club. Non-majors (undergraduates) must take at least one course in the Level II mathematics courses excluding Mathematics 353 and Mathematics 401 and also meet the above requirements.

ALPHA MU GAMMA HONOR SOCIETY

PURPOSE OF ALPHA MU GAMMA . . .

Alpha Mu Gamma has as its primary purpose the honoring of students for outstanding achievement during their foreign-language study in college.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP . . .
