The Prairie View Family concept has recently come into increasing use as an expression of the relationship between campus folk. One with good reason, often distrusts the validity of euphonies, and, as such, the Prairie View Family is not, nor should it be, automatically exempt from cool, careful appraisal. Three members of the family were left momentarily destitute when their trailer and all of their personal effects were destroyed by last Thursday night's fire. Before the embers stopped burning, however, students and faculty folk began planning rehabilitation. The Prairie View Collegians offered their service; a former fire victim began passing the hat; a loud speaking system blossomed by the fountain, and blared noisy exhortations; a nightwatchman started his own drive; placards appeared on bulletin boards and trees announcing a benefit activity, and before the embers stopped smoking, \$300.00, towels, soap, and other necessities had been given for family members Adams, Dancy and Sadler. The drive is continuing for a short time, and it is expected that many of the lost items will be replaced. A good job is being arranged for each man. These things, of course, can never completely efface their anguish or personal loss, but such action will let them know that they, too, are members of the family.
