# MOREASE IN STUDENT MONTHLY MAINTENANCE -

Due to the increase in cost of living, the University finds it necessary to make a \$2 increase in the monthly maintenance of students beginning January. The cost of food and dormitory care has increased to the extent that we have been faced with the alternative of reducing our standards or increasing the cost. Since a lower standard of maintenance was not atvisable, the increase was inevitable.

It is hoped that all employees of the institution will, as in the past, respect these rights of citizenship by paying Poll Tax on time. The rate for this County is \$1.75.
