THE COMMENCEMENT PROCESSION

An appropriate costume is a necessary part of Commencement. The costume includes a cap, a gown, and a hood. Each part of the costume has special significance. The most common head-piece (or cap) for the ceremony is the black square, flat-topped, or "mortar board" type with gold or black tassel. It is called a "mortar board" because it is shaped like the board of the mason which holds mortar. Recently we are seeing large velvet Tam-O-Shanter style of head pieces replacing the mortar board. Some of the velvet tams are brilliantly colored such as orange or bright blue.

The tassel on the doctor's cap is usually gold, and permanently fastened on the left side. The master's cap has a black tassel worn on the left. The bachelor's cap has a black tassel worn on the right prior to graduation then moved to the left during the ceremony.

The hood can be the most colorful part of the entire costume. The colors inside the hood are those of the college or university which is awarding the degree. The colors of the outside rim of the hood symbolizes one of the following departments of learning:

The gown is usually black. The traditional doctor's gown has velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the regular sleeves. The master's gown has no velvet, but does have unusually long sleeves. The bachelor's gown is similar to the master's gown but has regular long sleeves which tend to be pointed.

Some gowns may be in the color of the department granting the degree, such as "Education Blue." Others may be "Yale Blue" or "Harvard Crimson" for the graduates of these universities.

THE MACE

The mace is an ancient symbol of authority which is carried by the marshal ahead of the academic procession. The mace for Prairie View A&M University is four feet long and contains four bronze figures atop a Honduras mahogany base which tapers to fit into its stand. The four figures are symbolic of the four undergraduate academic years. Within the hollow area beneath the figures, and shared equally, is a flame which denotes knowledge and excellence. The base which serves as a grip and is carried by a faculty member, symbolizes the entire faculty; the stand which supports the mace characterizes the administration. The visual impact of the mace as a whole is "torch-like." The eight tassels represent the academic organization of the University.

THE MEDALLION

The President's Medallion, the official symbol of the Office of the President at Prairie View A&M University, was created especially to commemorate the lineage of the Presidency by the late Mr. Frank Hayden, nationally famous sculptor and Professor of Fine Arts at Southern University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

The first medallion was presented to Dr. Percy A. Pierre, fourth president of Prairie View A&M University, on March 21, 1985.

The medallion is designed to be worn with academic regalia at all official University programs. Abstract figures, representing the ten academic disciplines in an attitude of celebration, encircle the outer rim. The inner circle symbolizes the pursuit of excellence throughout four years of teaching and learning. The weave of the chain is the facsimile of that used by the ancient Greeks.

A replica will be presented to each subsequent President during his inauguration. The medallion will ultimately reflect the history of the presidency, revealing names and dates of inauguration.

CHARLES ALFONSO HINES, Ph.D. PRESIDENT, PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY

Dr. Charles A. Hines is the sixth President of Prairie View A&M University located in Prairie View, Texas. He has held this position since November 21, 1994. Born and raised in our Nations capitol, Washington, D.C., Dr. Hines joined the United States Army after graduating from Washington D.C.'s Dunbar High School. After serving in infantry and artillery units as an enlisted man, he was honorably discharged as a Sergeant in 1957 and immediately entered Howard University in Washington, D.C. Upon graduation from Howard University with a Bachelor of Science degree and a Regular Army commission, Dr. Hines embarked on a 30 year career as a commissioned officer, retiring in 1992 with the rank of Major General. Dr. Hines served as an adjunct professor with the University of Maryland for 22 years.

Dr. Hines holds a Ph.D. from The Johns Hopkins University, a Master of Science from Michigan State University, and a Master of Military Arts and Science from the Commanding General Staff College. He has completed management development programs at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, as well as the University of Maryland. He is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy.

During his career as an Army officer, Dr. Hines has held many important command and staff assignments. As a Colonel, he served as Director, Women in the Army Policy Review Group. In that capacity, he was instrumental in exponentially expanding opportunities for women in the Army. As a general officer, he served as Director, Officer Personnel Management Division at the Pentagon; Director of Manpower, Budget and Force Integration; and finally as Commanding General, United States Army Military Police and Chemical Schools and Fort McClellan, Fort McClellan, Alabama.

Dr. Hines has dedicated much of his personal, professional and academic life to equal opportunity, education and training, advancement of rights for women, race relations, and the development of youth. He has received numerous honors and awards. In 1992, he was inducted into the National Boys and Girls Club Hall of Fame. Most recently he was selected by the Southern Christian Leadership Conference as an Outstanding Black Man for 1994. He served as Director of Protection and Health Service for the Smithsonian Institution from August 1992 until he assumed his duties as the sixth President of Prairie View A&M University.

To The Class Of 1996

The late Vince Lombardi, former coach of the Green Bay Packers and later the Washington Redskins, once said, "winning is not everything, it's the only thing." This implies that losing is not an option.

Vince's statement is timeless. I find it particularly relevant to Prairie View A & M University, as we reflect on another year of recent football loses, and what it portends for the future.

As a pulling guard on the 1953 and 1954 national championship teams; middle linebacker and defensive captain on the 1955 and 1956 teams; an ROTC Cadet; and the first varsity football player to graduate from the college of engineering, I have experienced the "thrill of victory and the agony of defeat." It hurts to lose. It's even more painful to lose when we know we should be winning.

However, I encourage you to be patient. It took us over seven years to get into this situation and will take us more than two years to get out. Close observers will agree that we are already beginning to see signs of improvement. For example, the average points scored during the first eight games of the 1996 football were approximately 12.1 compared to 6.2 points a year ago. This success shows that we are **narrowing the spread each year**. Given our current circumstances, one can't ask for much more from our coaches and athletes.

And yet, the seemingly insignificant will to win has perhaps contributed more to the survival of the football program at Prairie View A & M University than any other entity including funds for scholarships. This comes as no surprise when one considers that Prairie View A & M University is inherently a competitive institution. It has its **competitive edge** because its faculty teaches its graduates how to **win and win big.** As President Hines puts it, **"there is something inside so strong,"** to borrow a stanza from a popular ballad. That's why the athletic program will return to the days when PVAMU was #1 in the Southwest Athletic Conference.

To that end, it is most refreshing to note that because of your selfless sacrifice, the athletic department awarded 49.1 full scholarships during the 1996-1997 academic year. Of this total 15.8 were football scholarships. The increase in your athletic assessment fee made the difference. Among the lessons learned during your matriculation here, there are three that you should carry with you the rest of your lives: <u>first</u>, while we may lose on the football field, PVAMU produces winners off the football field; <u>second</u>, giving back to PVAMU made a difference in 1996 and it will make difference in the future; and <u>lastly</u>, Vince's quote is not only analogous to football but life itself, i.e., "failure is not an option."

On behalf of the PVAMU National Alumni Association, I thank you and congratulate you upon your achievement as a graduate of one of America's finest institutions of higher learning. As years go by, you will come to realize that, as I have, that "much of what you are or ever hope to become you owe to PVU," now and through eternity.

Clearly, "Prairie View A & M University is a Treasure Worth Preserving." We should keep *Her* that way.
