

The enrollment closed for this Long Session with an all-time record of 2,225 students in all departments of the institution. The new system of registration worked out by Dr. Solomon was a decided improvement. Thus, the Registration this year went forward with practically no problems.

C. STATE FAIR

The Texas State Fair will observe again this year "Negro Day", October 17, with a football game between Prairie View and Wiley at night. It is predicted that upward of 40,000 colored people will be in attendance on the 17th.

The State Fair is not to be classed with the usual carnival. It is an institution of learning. It has been the practice of the Institution to permit any employee to attend this Fair on Negro Day, provided regular assignments are satisfied. Those who desire to be excused to go to Dallas, will kindly let the Directors know on or by October 10, so that provisions can be made for your duties.

The Faculty at Prairie View, for more than twelve years, sponsored what is known as the "Faculty Community Chest." The last issue of the Newsletter carried a financial statement of the last fiscal year's activity. It is a pleasure to announce that this noble activity will be continued this year. The amount of the contribution is figured on the basis of 2% of one month's salary, less the deductions for Federal Tax and Retirement contribution. It is the hope that we shall get this obligation out of the way early this year.

"If we are to bring the broad masses of the people in every land to the Table of abundance, it can only

be done by the <u>tireless</u> <u>improvement</u> of all our means of technical production, and by the diffusion in <u>every form of education</u> of an <u>improved cuality</u> to scores of millions of men and women."
