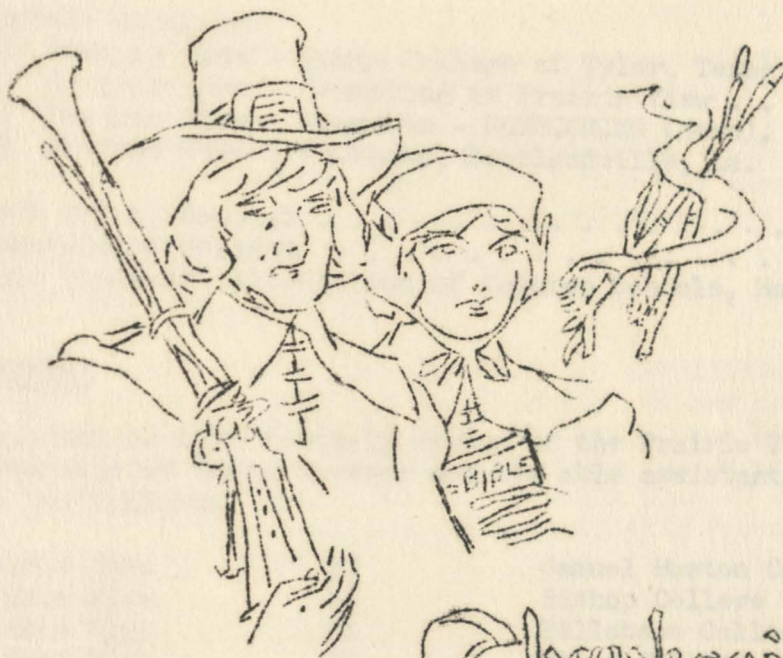


I. COMMUNITY CHEST
