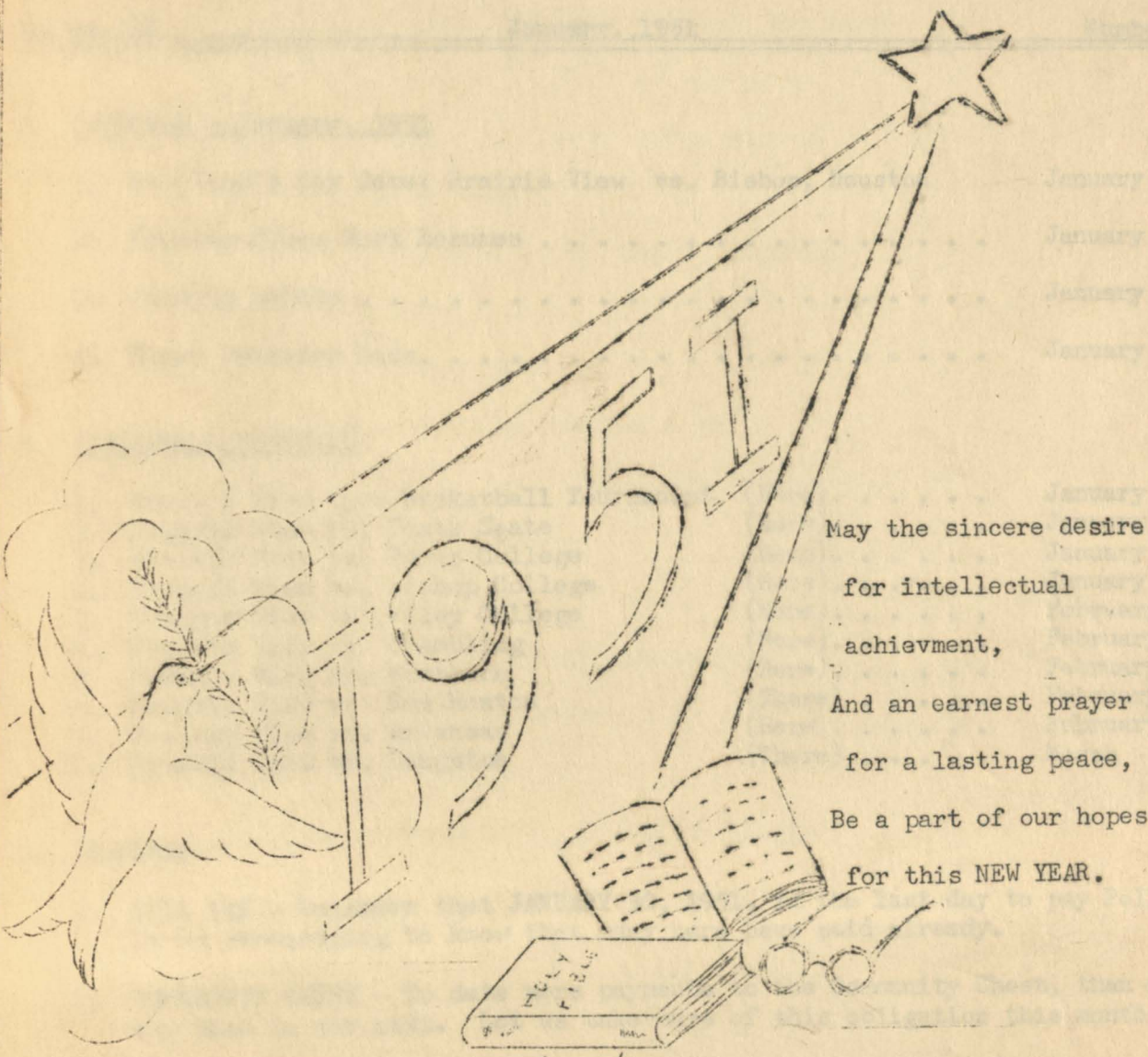

D. A HAPPY AND PROSPEROUS NEW YEAR !


These challenging words in Francis Thompson's "The Hound of Heaven" are recorded for our Season's meditation:
