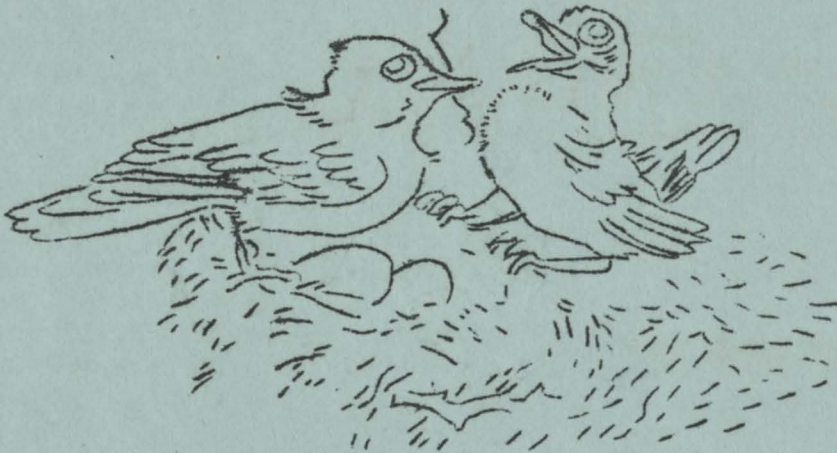

2. Second Faculty Entertainment - The Spring Faculty Entertainment Committee will be announced soon.


H. CONGRESSMAN WILLIAM L. DAWSON
