



# JULIUS WESLEY BECTON, JR. THE FIFTH PRESIDENT OF PRAIRIE VIEW A&M UNIVERSITY

# JULIUS W. BECTON, JR., Lt. Gen. (USA-Ret.) PRESIDENT

President Julius Wesley Becton's public service career includes two key federal positions after nearly 40 years of active commissioned service in the U.S. Army and rising to the rank of lieutenant general. He is the first graduate of Prairie View A&M University to attain star rank in the military. In November 1989 The Texas A&M University System Board of Regents unanimously elected him President of Prairie View A&M University.

After receiving his B.S. degree in mathematics from Prairie View A&M University in 1960, he later earned his M.A. degree in economics from the University of Maryland in 1967. He is also a graduate of top military schools, including the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, the Armed Forces Staff College and the National War College. He holds honorary degrees from Huston-Tillotson College in Austin and Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pennsylvania.

He enlisted in the U.S. Army in July 1944 and graduated from Officer's Candidate School in 1945. A veteran of World War II and the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, he has served in many positions at posts throughout this country. Overseas duties carried him to Germany, the Philippines, France, the Southwest Pacific, Korea, and Japan. His active duty assignments included Deputy Commanding General, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command; Commander, VII U.S. Corps in Germany; and Commander, 1st Cavalry Division; Commander, U.S. Army Test and Evaluation Agency.

He served 22 months as director of the Office of U.S. Foreign Disaster Assistance before being nominated by the President and confirmed by the Senate as director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, a position he held for nearly four years before moving into the private sector. Prior to his acceptance of the position of president of Prairie View A&M University, he served as chief operating officer for American Coastal Industries.

President Becton also recently completed service as the chairman of a New Select Group of the Senior Civil Emergency Planning Committee of NATO in Brussels, Belgium.

The native of Bryn Mawr, Pa., served as the secretary on the World Board of Governors for the United Services Organization (USO). He is 1st Vice President of the U.S. Armor Association, a member of the Federal Emergency Management Agency Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees for Valley Forge Military Academy and Junior College, and the Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute Board of Visitors. He has recently been appointed a member of President Bush's Advisory Board for Historically Black Colleges and Universities, and a Board member of The Fund for Improvement of Post Secondary Education. He has been listed in many Who's Who directories and was named by *Ebony Magazine* several times as "One of the 100 Most Influential Blacks in America." Other honors include the Distinguished Service Awards for the Association of the U.S. Army and the Federal Emergency Management Agency; Distinguished Knight, Order of St. George; and Honorary Colonel, 17th Cavalry Regiment.

He is married to the former Louise Thornton, and they have five children—Shirley, Karen, Joyce, Renee and Wesley. They also have six grandchildren and one great grandson.
