#### They Have Hearts of Purple and Gold

It has often been said that if a Prairie View graduate were examined anatomically or if given a psychological examination there would not be found any trace of school spirit. This may or may not be true; real school spirit is very much like real Christianity - it kind of grows on a person. But even if a Prairie View person had school spirit it is very doubtful if he would brag about it - we seldom brag anyway - since it is something you feel rather than exclaim about; real school spirit causes persons to act rather than talk. And there is concrete evidence that this feeling, long dormant or hidden in Prairie View folk, is beginning to evolve.

Plans for the dance honoring Prairie View's football team last Tuesday evening were rather hastily made, and decoration of the Recreation Hall game room would have been inadequate or totally lacking had it not been for a group of "spiritless" graduates and graduate students. Oddly enough, it was not necessary to wave a purple and gold banner in front of their faces in order to get this particular job done, and although it took some two hours to arrange the crepe paper and hang some forty nine footballs, with names of each member of the Panther squad thereon, these "spiritless men and women worked without complaint, without glory. The time they spent was their own, that is, after five o'clock. The fruits of their labor created an atmosphere of football festivity, for which the football men were entirely appreciative.
