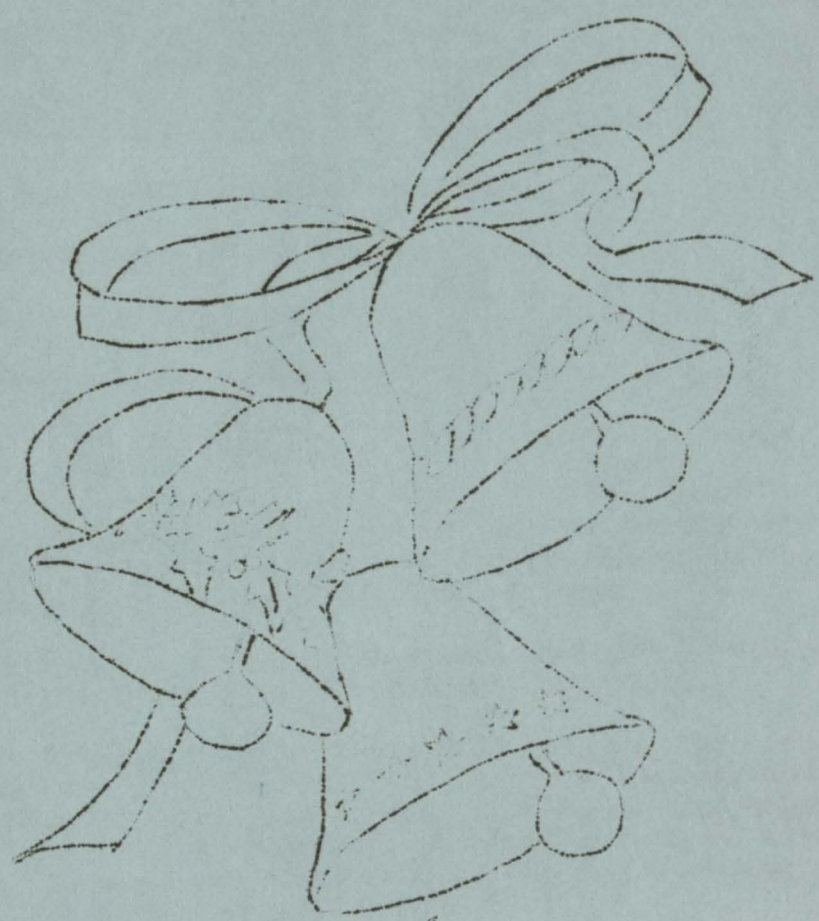

B. REMINDERS

1. Poll Tax - Remember that January 30, 1952 is the last day to pay Poll Tax. It is our responsibility as citizens to meet this requirement for the privilege of voting in the State of Texas.
2. Community Chest - Those who have not taken care of this community contribution should do so at the earliest convenience.
3. Texas Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act - The recent Texas Legislature passed the Texas Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act, effective January 1, which is a security type safety responsibility law. In case of accident, security must be deposited (subject to exceptions), and proof of financial responsibility for the future is required. No one is required to carry liability insurance.

C. OPEN BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

Each year, the college sponsors an open basketball tournament at the beginning of the season. Some twenty-five or more colleges have already entered which include the major teams in the south. Scheduled for January 4-5, this activity will give the Prairie View family as well as the coaches and players an opportunity to observe the very best in collegiate basketball, and will serve as an indicator for the teams to watch in the coming season.

D. FINAL EXAMINATIONS (First Semester)

January 21 through 25 are the important dates to remember for it is the close of our first half of academic work for the term. Teachers are urged to give full emphasis to the important "check up" time, and schedule, which will be released soon, should be followed very closely in conducting the examinations.

E. REGISTRATION

The Registrar's Office announces that they have tentatively set the week of January 14 for advanced registration for the second semester by all students who are currently enrolled.

The regular registration period, January 28-29 will be observed for new students and those regular students who failed to take advantage of the advanced registration period. All fees must be paid prior to registration.

For a Happy and Prosperous New Year


With the closing of the old year, Prairie View marked up its seventy-fifth year of service to Texas and the nation.
