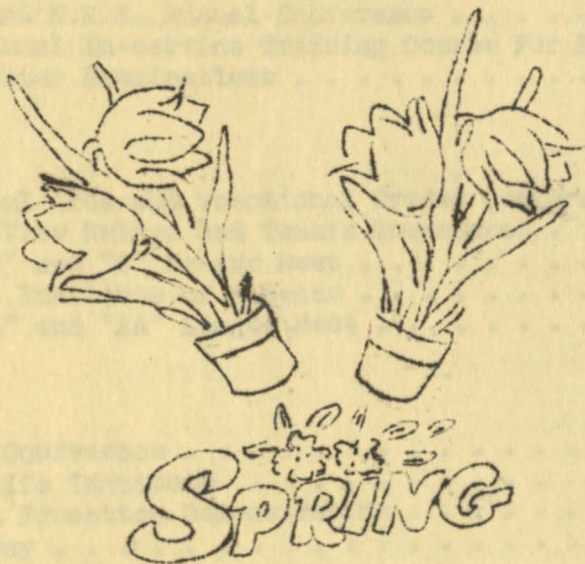

K. IN CLOSING


Let me repeat the message to teachers made by Honorable Harry S. Truman, President of the United States:
