Dr Pierre Lecomte du Nouy and Miss Elouise Carter

Dr Pierre Lecomte du Nouy is a scientist of the first magnitude with several higher degrees which attest to his academic acumen. In less than 300 pages he has set down with remarkable lucidity goals attainable by man now that his physical evolution is nearly complete. His book, HUMAN DESTINY, is a must for those persons who are sincere in their pursuance of truth. Using the scientist's exactitude, Dr du Nouy discredits theories proposing that human life could have appeared on earth by pure chance. It is his opinion that it will be some time before men will begin to think universally; "to consider themselves as elements of humanity as a whole."
