The Acceptance of Paradox

Heraclitus said in effect that "nothing is constant but change." Life, however, which has thus far been continuous seems to one exception to that rule; this, of course, is not necessarily so. It was thought, before microphotography that a pin point was a point indeed, but now we know it to be a mass of metal held together by molecular attraction - the point is, in fact, rough. Things are relative: to us a mixture of salt and pepper seems gray; to a tiny organism such a mixture would appear as black and white mountains. If we can ever perceive truth it is to be hoped that it, too, will represent constancy. Appreciation and acceptance of relativity constitutes appreciation and acceptance of paradox.

How well do we as men and women handling educable and formative minds accept change, and appreciate paradox?
