Henderson.

Then there are the Sister and Brother members, Miss Meatra Harrison (2.0) and Alfred Harrison (2.2); then the perennial members, Sisters Ruth and Romona Vaughn (2.9 and 2.3) and Brothers Alton and Corliss Branch (2.1 and 2.2).

SOME ADDITIONAL FACTS

There were 56 male and 74 female students on the honor roll. 48 veterans (46 male and 2 female) are included in the 130 students who made the honor roll. 8.2% of male students and 9.5% of female students enrolled made the honor roll. Veterans composed 28% of total enrollment during the first semester and made up 37% of the honor roll.
