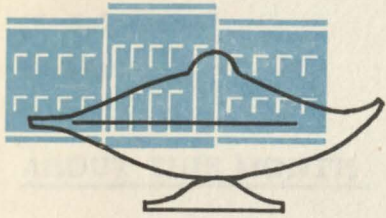

Sports Program


Baseball, golf and track are scheduled for the March athletic agenda.
