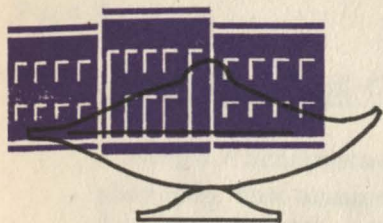


G. NEW ARRIVALS
