

THE EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE

The 28th Annual Educational Conference will be held on Friday, March 1. The program this year, which centers around the improvement of Mental Health of Texas Youth, is one in which all members of the staff can participate, and it is our hope that you will. Following the presentation of findings by the Research Committee, the conference participants will divide into interest groups for discussion and planning ways of improving mental health through (1) guidance and personal services, (2) recreational and leisure time activities, (3) utilizing the strengths of family life, and (4) community service.

The opening session will begin promptly at 9:00 o'clock. Junior and Senior students are expected to attend. Faculty members are encouraged to make needed arrangements pertaining to lower division classes in order to attend and participate. All schools and departments are expected to furnish displays and exhibits.

Many outstanding persons will be our guests on this occasion, and it is my hope that everyone will contribute in making their visit a pleasant and profitable experience.

MEDICAL AND NURSING CONFERENCES

Two equally important conferences will follow the March 1 event. The Postgraduate Medical Assembly is scheduled March 4-7 and the In-Service Nurses Conference, March 5-8. Both are professional meetings held for members of these professions throughout the state. Several state agencies and organizations cooperate with the college in sponsoring these sessions each year.

Both groups have scheduled outstanding speakers and consultants during the week's activities. A public health meeting is scheduled on the evening of March 5, and several social events are planned which are designed to include the entire college staff.

STATE BAND FESTIVAL

Among the Interscholastic League events scheduled during the winter and spring will come the annual Band Festival, March 7-9, which, this year, promises to be the most spectacular in history.
