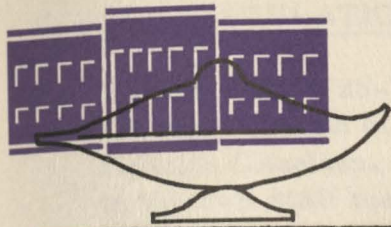


I. NEW ARRIVAL
