The Texas AGM University Regents recently voted to approve purchase of a \$250,000 fire truck for joint use for the City of Prairie View and Prairie View A&M University. The funds will come from the Available University Fund (AUF).

The minute order, submitted by PVAMU President Julius W. Becton, Jr., and approved by the regents, described the fire truck as "a 1000 GMP telesquirt fire truck with a 75 foot boom and auxiliary quipment'

Since September 1987, Prairie View A&M University has had a joint firefighters program agreement with the City of Prairie View. There are now over 20 qualified university staff and local volunteer firefighters in the program.


