

G. IN CLOSING

Next year the Land-Grant Colleges and State Universities of this country will celebrate their 100th anniversary. Abraham Lincoln signed the Land-Grant Act into law on July 2, 1862.

Throughout this year a great deal of attention will be given to projecting special programs and projects for the Centennial celebration. As a part of this great movement, we at Prairie View should want to extoll the virtues of the State university and help to develop a better understanding of our great role in higher education in America.

As a good start in this direction, I would like to quote a distinguished newspaper publisher, Mr. John Cowles (a Harvard graduate), as he spoke recently on this important subject:

"First, it is inevitable that in the immediate and continuing future the responsibilities and scope of the Land-Grant institutions are going to be immeasurably larger than they have been, not only actually but also in relation to the other segments of our over-all educational system. Second, if the Land-Grant institutions should fail, quantitatively or qualitatively, to play to the full the role which destiny is assigning them, I doubt that we will have a free society and a democratic form of government in the United States a century hence."
