

I. IN CLOSING

An interesting research study being promoted by Arizona State University may have some definite implications to some of our own problems. Entitled "Attitudes and Words", the researchers show that there is some carefully controlled experimental support for the principle of repetition in persuasion, plus some knowledge of how and under what conditions the principle works. They also prove that attitudes toward persons, groups and objects can be developed in the same way. Consistent pairing of a group with negative words (e.g. Negro-slums, kill-rape-burly-etc.) in the mass media is known to develop a negative attitude toward said group. Consistent pairing of a group with positive words (good-honest-cleanetc.) will produce a desirable effect.
