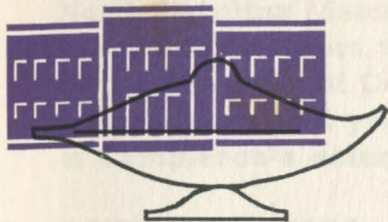



J. IN CLOSING

What Makes A Teacher "Good"? was the subject of a recent study at the University of Wisconsin. The analysis revealed that there is no one answer to what constitutes a good teacher, but the following six general characteristics were isolated:

1. Intelligence. The intelligence category includes subject matter knowledge, cultural backgrounds, understanding of students and how the learning process takes place.
2. A thorough understanding and basic knowledge of and about the subject matter taught.
3. Good verbal facility. The good teacher must be able to express himself and present his subject matter well.
4. The good teacher must have creative imagination. This makes class work interesting to the point where the student will want to learn.
5. Physical energy and drive are other factors which tend to make a teacher "good."
6. Such moral and personal prerequisites as PATIENCE, CONSIDERATENESS, EMOTIONAL STABILITY, JUDGEMENT AND MATURITY.
