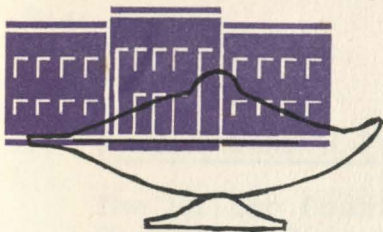


L. CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS
