

### F. IN CLOSING

President Johnson has proposed an Arts-Humanities Foundation which would give support to these areas of learning similar to those now existing in scientific fields. The legislation would include --

- (1) \$10 million a year to be divided equally between the Arts and Humanities
- (2) \$500,000 a year for use under State plans formulated through State Departments of Education
- (3) \$500,000 a year for grants to institutions of higher education to conduct teacher training institutes in the humanities and arts at the elementary-secondary level.
