PHYSICAL IMPROVEMENTS

The Board of Directors of the Texas A & M University System approved the following physical improvement projects for Prairie View during its June meeting.

- Awarded a \$55,000 contract for dormitory rehabilitation.
- Appropriated \$7,000 for improvement of parking facilities.
- Construction is now underway on renovation of the College Library at a cost of \$103,142. Improvements at Spence Hall will cost \$29,258.

GIFTS AND GRANTS

President A. I. Thomas has acknowledged receipt of the following gifts and grants for Prairie View A & M.

- \$170,000 federal grant under Title III of the Higher Education Act of 1963, Strengthening Developing Institutions.
- \$11,000 from American Society for Engineering.
- \$3,000 from Union Carbide Corporation.
- \$3,000 from Sears Roebuck Foundation.
- \$1,000 from The Honeywell Corporation.
- \$10,612 U S Office of Education grant for Library resources.
- \$1,450 from Washington D C. Alumni Club.
- \$1,000 from Pan-American Petroleum Foundation.
- \$650 gift of auto equipment from Hempstead Motor Company.
- \$32,000 for support of a project entitled "Regional Experimental Program for Educational Computer Utilization."

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDI ENTS

Two proposed amendments of great concern to colleges and universities in Texas will appear on the ballot in the special election to be held on August 5. Proposed Amendment No. 6 would remove the interest limitations on all bonds authorized by the State Constitution. Proposed Amendment No. 8 authorizes the Coordinating Board to issue \$200 million in State of Texas College Student Loan Bonds in addition to the previously authorized \$85 million in bonds. The coordinating Board is seeking all possible help on behalf of these Amendments.

NROTC FLIGHT INDOCTRINATION PROGRAM

Plans are now being completed for instituting an NROTC Flight Indoctrination Program for the Fall of 1969. This program is quite similar to the Army ROTC Flight Indoctrination Program which was initiated at the college during the past year. The Navy's Program will enable successful students to be certified as private airplane pilots.

RECORD OF P V PRE-MED GRADS

Noting that a Prairie View graduate was the first Negro to receive the M. D. Degree from Baylor College of Medicine, the Biology Department has pointed up the fact that since 1952 a total of 25 P. V. graduates have enrolled in the University of Texas Medical School in Galveston, and 24 have received the M. D. Degree. Dr. L. C. Collins further states that our record in V. T. Dental School is 100%.
