Sponsored annually by the Women's Council, the 1969 Coronation carries the theme, "What It's All About." More than 60 campus queens and student organization representatives are participating in the colorful event.

HOMECOMING, 1969

Homecoming activities will begin Friday night, November 7, when the traditional college bonfire and pep rally get under-way. Also scheduled Friday night is the Pigskin Revue, featuring Martha Reeves and the Van Dellias.

Reunion classes include 1909, 1919, 1929, 1939, 1949, and 1959. The theme for the occasion is, "Learning Today--Leading Tomorrow." Saturday's activities include the parade, football game, pregame and halftime shows, alumni and student social activities. Sunday's schedule includes Special Homecoming religious services at 11:00 o'clock and the Vespers program featuring a Fine Arts presentation by the Language Department.

VETERANS DAY

Veterans Day will be observed on campus on November 11. The Army and Navy ROTC Units will sponsor a program in cooperation with the local Veterans Club.

PRESIDENT'S CONVOCATION

Dr. Michael DeBakey, a famed heart specialist from Houston, will be the speaker at the President's Convocation scheduled on November 20.

CENTENNIAL COUNCIL

The fifth and final general meeting of the College's Centennial Council was held at the Royal Coach Inn in Houston on November 1. The group of seventy-five prominent citizens has concluded a year's study of conditions and needs at Prairie View and are drawing up recommendations. A final meeting will be held at which time the Council will formally present its findings and recommendations to the Board of Directors. It is anticipated that this meeting will be held on campus early in the new calendar year.

Notification has been received from the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) that Prairie View A&M College's Teacher Education programs have been approved for a period of ten years.

STAFF NOTES


